

Burundi electricity market



Overview

Burundi triples electricity capacity in five years, reaching 166. Jiji-Mulembwe hydropower complex aims to supply 15,000 households and 7,000 businesses.

Introduction Burundi is a small, densely populated landlocked country in East Africa with a population of approximately 13.5 million people and one of the lowest per capita incomes globally. The country faces severe energy challenges, with only 11.6% of the population having access to electricity. Total energy supply (TES) includes all the energy produced in or imported to a country, minus that which is exported or stored. The majority of electricity generation relies on hydroelectric plants, though reliance on diesel fuel has increased, with oil use rising. The average electricity price in Burundi has decreased from ~\$133/MWh in 2023 to ~\$116/MWh in 2024.
