Base Station: A stationary radio located in a strategic position, such as a hospital, dispatch center, or a high vantage point, enabling wide-area communication coverage. professional communications lesson 1: getting vocab right! the exchange of information between two or more persons. the radio communication, interference in a radio signal. A base station is a radio operated from a fixed site such as a dispatch center, hospital, or some other location. It usually runs off community electrical power and transmits at much higher power than smaller, portable radios.

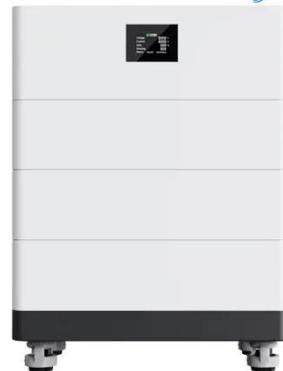
