

How many volts of power supply should I use for an optical modem

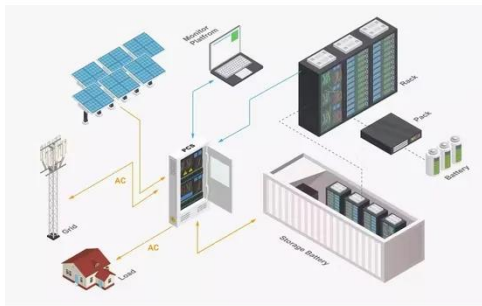
